Odin's journey on horseback near the Dagestan Nature Reserve in present-day Russia along the northwestern coast of the Caspian Sea.

The Raido rune is drawn in the shape of Odin's journey on horseback near the Dagestan Nature Reserve in present-day Russia. His journey forms the shape of the letter "R."

According to legend, Odin's spear pierced his eye and he hung by one ankle from a tree for nine days before he was rescued and this was his sacrifice. In actuality, Odin was strung up by Marcus, who was waiting for him in a tree.

Initially, Odin set out for Valhalla on horseback in search of his daughter, Sif. On his way back, heading south, Odin's ankle was caught in a snare Marcus had set near a tree.

Marcus questioned Odin about his journey and Odin explained he had gone looking for his daughter in order to teach her how to read. Eventually, Marcus released Odin, and dropped him off near the coast, at the end of his "journey."

The rune is drawn according to the path Odin took traveling to and from Valhalla, a region along the western shore of the Caspian Sea, located in the vicinity of Russia's Dagestan Nature Reserve.
